



Youth Code of Conduct – WSJ '27

I will:

- Treat everyone with fairness, respect and dignity, and be accepting of everyone I meet regardless of race, cultural identity or sexual preference.
- Be respectful of everyone's personal space.
- Come prepared for Jamboree activities and ensure I am dressed appropriately for each activity.
- Remember that my behaviour must always be safe for myself, and others.
- Conduct badge trading only with other youth participants (no adults) and ensure it is done in a fair manner.
- Sleep in my own campsite and respect Jamboree quiet hours.
- Ensure that the Jamboree site is kept clean and that my garbage and recycling is disposed of properly.
- Ensure everyone I am interacting with is safe from bullying, abuse, harassment and discrimination. If I notice any of these behaviours but I am unable to stop it, I will report it to a Scouter or other responsible adult.
- Make sure Scouts Canada's and the ASC's youth protection policies and procedures are followed, and ensure that all my interactions with adults and Scouters follow the Two-Scouter rule.
- Take part in any review conducted by Scouts Canada, the ASC or any local authority including the Jamboree.
- I will report any of violation of this code of conduct or inappropriate behaviors to the nearest Scouter, responsible adult or a member of the Jamboree Safe From Harm team.



I will not:

- Bully, harass or use violence against another youth or adult.
- Knowingly break any Canadian or Polish laws or those of another country the contingent may be traveling through.
- Carry, share, or use alcohol, tobacco, marijuana, energy drinks, illegal drugs, or anything dangerous.
- Enter restricted or prohibited areas.
- I agree that I will not use any cell phone, smartphone, tablet, computer, camera, camcorder or any other device capable of taking or transmitting photographs or recordings in any private spaces.
- Participate in any activity that looks unsafe or is not approved by the Jamboree.
- Stand back and watch bullying, abuse, harassment or discrimination against someone else without reporting it.
- Cover-up or prevent the reporting of behaviour against this code of conduct.



CONSEQUENCES OF NON-COMPLIANCE: Violations of this policy will be referred to the Executive Leadership Team (ELT) of the Contingent Management Team (CMT) as well as the Scouts Canada Safety and Jamboree Safe From Harm teams depending on the nature of the incident.

I UNDERSTAND THAT:

- I can be issued with a warning for violating this code of conduct and it will be sent to my parents or guardians.
- If I am issued with multiple warnings I may be sent home early from the Jamboree. This will result in me returning home with little to no warning and no refund for the Jamboree. I will also be responsible for any additional travel costs incurred by booking last-minute travel.
- Any serious violation of this code of conduct can have me sent home immediately without previous written warning at my own cost. Examples of serious violations include, but are not limited to:
 - Illegal activity under Canadian or Polish law
 - Sexually inappropriate behaviour
 - Physical assault, abuse or other forms of violence
 - Emotional or verbal abuse
 - Use of illegal substances
 - Voyeurism / recording people in private spaces (washrooms/showers etc)

Remember: Living by this Code keeps the Jamboree safe, fun, and welcoming for everyone!

I understand that I will be required to accept the Jamboree code of conduct when it is released closer to the event.
